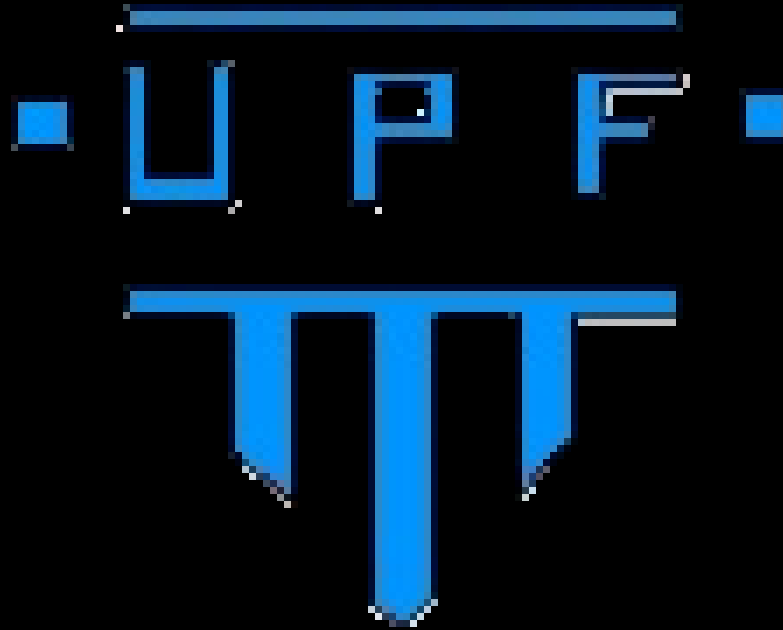

This form of Warrant rank is mandatory for those promoted to Warrant without first being Enlisted or Specialist

Exception: Star law and Emergency Service Legion have no enlisted grades. Therefore ,all specialist and warrants are required to use the full chevron pattern.

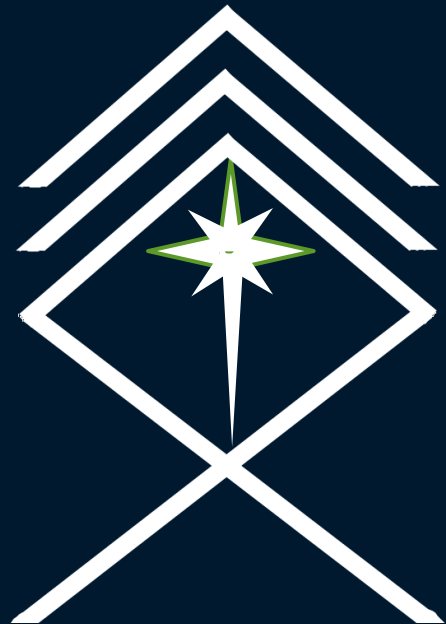

Unified Officer Rank Structure

- To prevent confusion in the command structure a single progression was devised to represent all branches of the uniformed services .
 - Note the absence of the term “captain” this term is now a reserved word meaning any officer in charge of a sea or aerospace vessel with capacity of greater than 25 souls.
